The contribution of citizens to the European Commission's legislative proposal

The citizens' perspective

Citizens' Panels are now **part of the Commission's policymaking** in certain key areas, as announced by President von der Leyen on the occasion of her <u>State of the Union Address</u> on 14 September 2022.

Time to reduce Food Waste in the EU

In addition to a wide range of consultations, the Commission convened a Citizens' Panel **to deliberate and make recommendations on actions** to be taken by Member States, actors in the food supply chain, citizens and other stakeholders, in order to step up efforts to reduce food waste and achieve targets.



A Panel of **147 citizens, randomly selected,** representative of **EU diversity, was convened**. One third were young people aged 16-25.

What do citizens recommend?

The Citizens' Panel put forward 23 recommendations.

They called for a **broad approach**, engaging all actors and **strengthening** collaboration across the **food supply chain**.

The recommendations present **3 lines of action** aiming to:

- Strengthen the cooperation in the food value chain;
- · Encourage food business initiatives;
- Support consumer behavioural change.

They include recommendations among others:

- Ensure cooperation and solidarity to facilitate the redistribution of surplus food to those in need;
- · Further encourage research on innovative and sustainable packaging;
- Promote the role of education to build understanding and appreciation of the value of food.

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What next?

The Citizens' Report from the Panel with the full set of recommendations is published together with the Commission's legislative proposal

It is the first concrete and structured contribution by citizens to the development of European political and legislative initiatives, resulting from an exercise in participatory democracy.

The outcome of the Citizens' Panel will continue to **support the overarching work** of the Commission on food waste

Citizens' recommendations indicate points for further consideration, such as:

- Taking measures to **forbid the destruction of safe, surplus food**;
- Research on innovative and sustainable packaging;
- The need to improve outreach and engagement with citizens across the EU on these issues, by the EU and Member States.

Importantly, the outcome of the Panel will serve as a **guide to help Member States** in achieving the targets.

Citizens' recommendations will be shared and discussed with the <u>EU Platform on Food Losses and Food Waste</u> bringing together Member States and stakeholders, in view of being considered in national food waste prevention programmes.
